Point & Figure Relative Strength tool is the ranking system we use for Stocks, ETF's • Daily Calculation:  $\text{Stock X } 100 = \text{Relative Strength Index}$  Reading • This reading is plotted on a Point & Figure chart which then tells us whether we can expect that stock or ETF to outperform or underperform the base index Relative Strength Calculation
